

# **About Drug Addiction and Opioid Dependence**

#### Addiction<sup>1</sup>

Addiction is a brain disease characterized by a chronic, relapsing physical and psychological dependence on a behavior or substance. Addiction may lead a person to pursue problematic habits, despite harm caused to themself or others.

Warning Signs of Addiction	Criteria to Assess Severity of Substance Use Disorder (SUD)
☐ Ignoring commitments or responsibilities	☐ Lack of control
Problems at work, school, or home	☐ Desire to limit use
Unexplained absences	☐ Time spent procuring opioids
Appearing to have a new set of friends	Cravings for the drug of choice
Considerable monetary fluctuations	
☐ Changes in sleep pattern	☐ Lack of responsibility
☐ Lapses in concentration or memory	☐ Problems with relationships
☐ Being oddly secretive about parts of personal life	Loss of interest in other activities
☐ Sudden mood swings and changes in behavior	☐ Use continues despite dangerous circumstances
☐ Unusual lack of motivation	Use continues despite worsened physical or
☐ Weight loss or changes in physical appearance	psychological problems
☐ Withdrawal from normal social contacts	☐ Increased tolerance to drug of choice

## Opioid Use Disorder (OUD)2

OUD includes dependence and addiction, consisting of an overwhelming desire to use opioids, increased tolerance to them, and withdrawal symptoms when their use is stopped. The disorder is clinically defined as the repeated occurrence of at least two of the criteria below within a year of opioid use.
